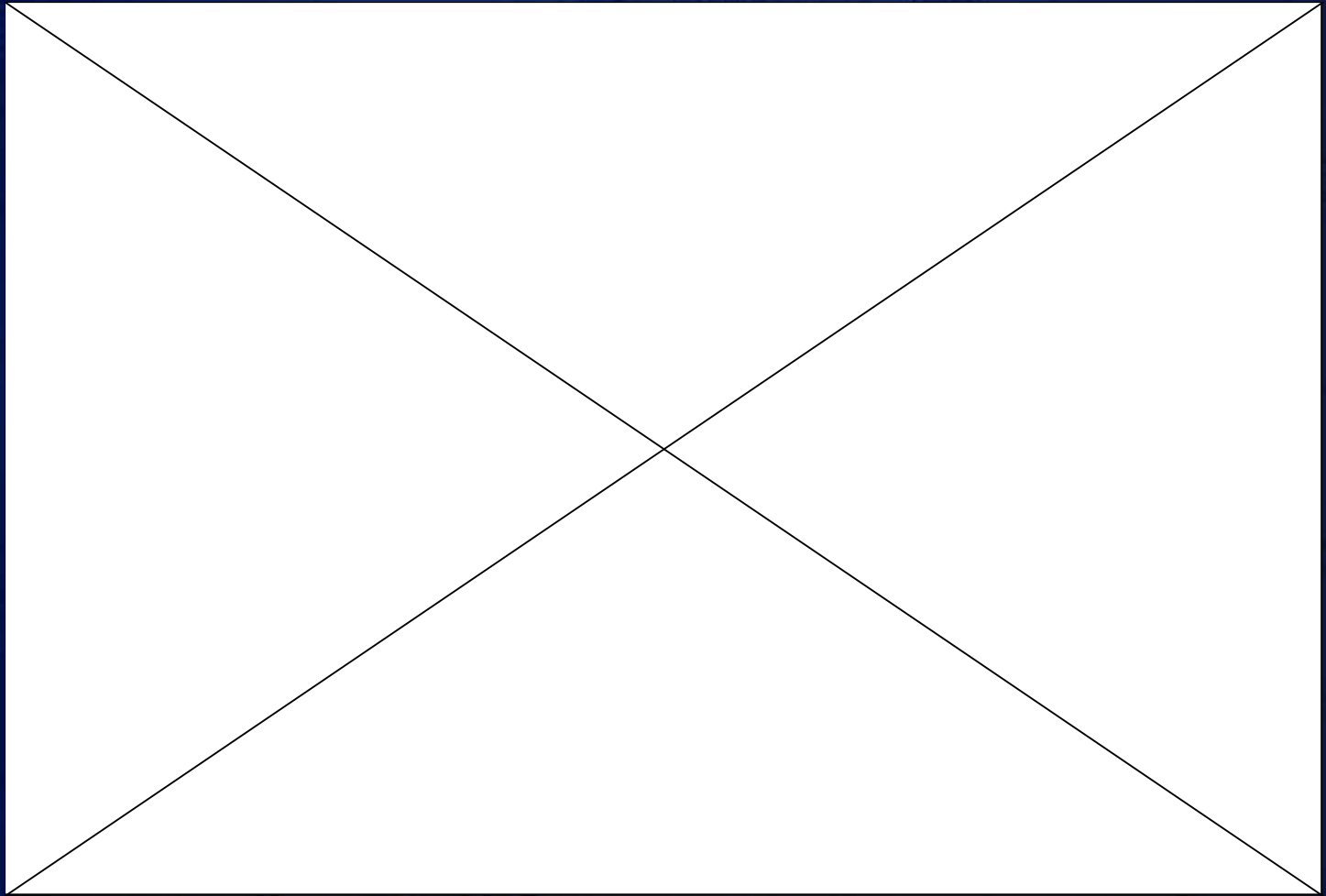

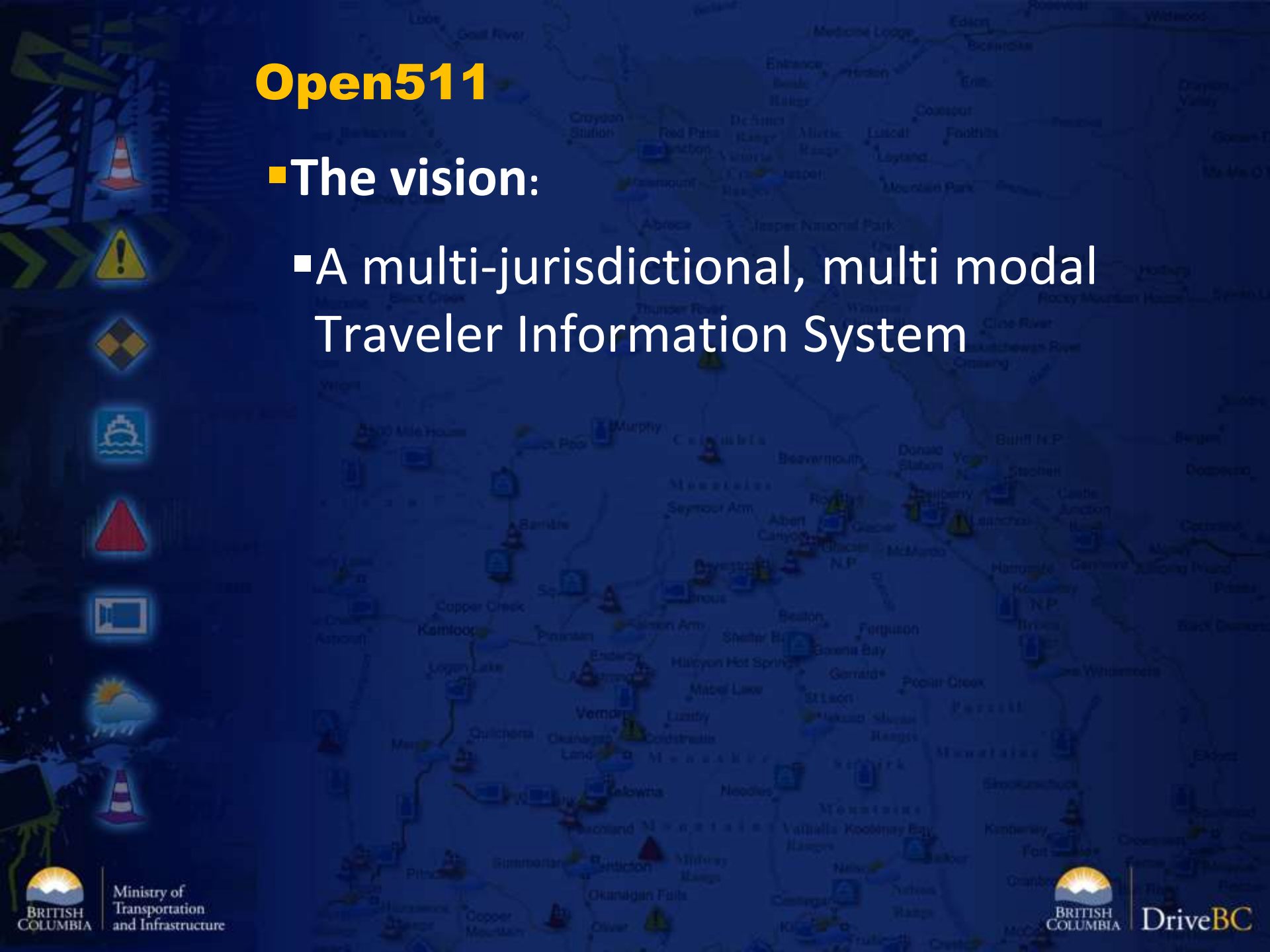
Height Restriction Tool

- The Height Restriction Tool displays clearance restriction for given vehicle dimensions and destination provided by users.
- Utilizing Google Map functionality, this feature also provides users with turn-by-turn directions and is readily available on DriveBC.
- This tool is geared towards drivers operating oversized vehicles requiring a permit to travel.

Open511

- The vision:

- A multi-jurisdictional, multi modal Traveler Information System



Open511

■ The benefits

- Cross jurisdictions communication: share data between cities, regions, provinces and private contractors;
- Public safety: make road status available to local and national public safety bodies (fire department, police, disaster support)
- Traveler information: allow commuters and road professional to improve their planning

- Standards for sharing

Open North

- A Canadian Non-profit organisation that received a grant from GeoConnections to develop the standard

GeoConnections

- is a Federal Government designed to facilitate access to and use of geospatial information in Canada

Current Scope

- Road event data (accident, construction, special events & weather/road conditions)

- Traffic cameras
